The project focuses on improving the resilience, productivity, and socio- economic conditions of women and men in the fishing communities as well as the ecological sustainability of the Tonle Sap Biosphere Reserve (TSBR) through community-centered interventions that improve access to safe water and sanitation, enhanced education opportunity and quality for vulnerable and poor girls and boys with increased availability and accessibility to education.
